Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850,

entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 2574 for 80 acres,

issued in favor of *Alfred Cunningham private in Captain Clements Company Colonel Means Regiment South Carolina Militia War of 1812*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said

*Alfred Cunningham and heirs*
